Ignacio Flores is the Federal Aviation Administration's (FAA) Director for the Office of Airports, Southwest Region, ASW-600. Previously, he also held the following positions: Manager of Safety and Standards Branch in AGL; Standards and Procedures Officer for International Civil Aviation Authority; FAA Airport Safety Inspector, and he worked at O'Hare International Airport in the operations department.

Mr. Flores holds a Bachelor's degree in Aviation from Saint Louis University and a Master's degree in Finance from the University of Illinois. He also holds a multi-engine instrument rated pilot license.
